The two students of CEIP Alba Plata go to class wearing masks after the conflict was resolved thanks to mediation.

They have gone to school today with their masks, so that "the conflict has been resolved in the educational environment thanks to mediation, the monitoring carried out from the school and the willingness of the family to constant dialogue".

The two students of 3rd and 5th grade of Primary, who did not attend class because their family refused to wear the mask in compliance with the prevention protocol of the COVID-19, have been greeted with applause by their classmates and peers. Thus, the school day has passed "with normality and joy," said Amaya.

The Secretary General of Education has said that in Education conflicts are always addressed through mediation and dialogue, putting in agreement the different sectors of the educational community. Following the usual procedure in these cases, from the first day of class until yesterday, the tutors and the direction of the center have been in contact with the family to worry about the situation of the girls and the family has always been willing to listen to teachers.

Francisco Javier Amaya stressed that throughout this process, the Ministry of Education and Employment "has always prioritized the best interests of the child, the integrity of these girls, without endangering the health and safety of other members of the educational community".

In this sense, Amaya has specified that the day that, of provisional form, the students were in a classroom separated from their companions and companions, it was done following the measures of security, as they are the ventilation and the interpersonal distance.

In addition, the secretary general has said that, although the case has been resolved in the educational field, the Ministry of Education and Employment will continue to request the report from the Prosecutor for Minors "to serve as an example of how to act when we have evidence or indications that may be violating some of the fundamental rights".

Francisco Javier Amaya has requested the collaboration of the media so that "the students cease to be the focus of attention and the center can continue the course normally, like the rest of the educational centers of the Community".
